

RQG 2026 BOM - June

One block 15" x 15" finished (15 ½ x 15 ½ unfinished).

Block #6 - Modified Calgary Stampede

This is the last 15" block for this quilt and we only need one.

Cut from background

4 - 2 ½" squares

12 - 3" squares

4 - 3 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles

Cut from focus fabric (black)

1 - 7 ½" square

4 - 2 ½" squares

Cut from Fabric 1 (red)

4 - 3" squares

Cut from Fabric 2 (green)

4 - 2 ½" squares

2 - 5 ½" squares

Half Square Triangles (make 8)

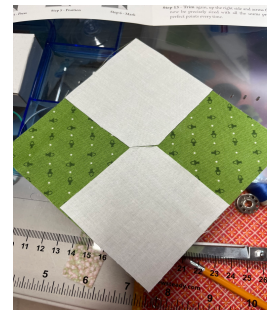
1. Start with the 3" squares of background and of Fabric 1. Place one of each RST, draw diagonal, sew ¼" on each side, cut on the line and press. (We pressed seams open.) Trim to 2 ½" x 2 ½".



Flying Geese (make 8)

2. Use the 2 - 5 ½" squares of Fabric 2 and 8 - 3" background squares to make 8 flying geese. (Again, we used the Deb Tucker method to make the flying geese. Complete instructions can be found at Studio180Design.net. Click on Free Downloads, scroll down to Fundamental Tools, then click on Wing Clipper I)

Note: to reduce bulk, draw a line where the squares intersect and trim the point from the top square. Next, draw a line on the "bottom" square and trim the point. Trim the flying geese units to 2 ½" x 4 ½".



Block Center (make 1)

3. Use the 7 ½" focus fabric square and the 4 - 2 ½" green squares. Place one small square on each of the corner of the large focus fabric square. Draw a diagonal line, stitch on the line trim and press away from the large square.



Four Patches for the corners (make 4)

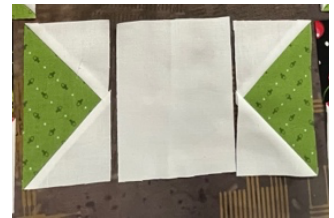
4. Assemble the four patches for the corners. See figure pressing suggestion. This unit measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Double Flying Geese Units (make 4)

5. Assemble the four double flying geese units and press to the center. This unit measures $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $7\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Modified Calgary Stampede - Finished Block (make 1)

6. Lay out the 9 parts. Stitch the parts into rows and the rows together. The unfinished block measures $15\frac{1}{2}$ " x $15\frac{1}{2}$ ".
